This sparkler will make the perfect aperitif for any meal - lunch or dinner!</p>	£10	£57

## CHAMPAGNE

- 300 Pol Roger Brut Réserve, Épernay, NV** £72.50  
Pol Roger is comprised of 30 base wines taken from at least two vintages. On the nose this fizz has an abundance of green apple and sweet brioche. On the palate a little nuttiness married with stone fruits. For us in the UK, Pol Roger age our stock for an additional 6 months post-disgorgement so it is perfect for a glass as soon as it reaches our cellar.
- 302 Louis Roederer Vintage, 2008/09** £97.50  
Roederers vintage expressions typically offer a generosity of scale; these are rich, ample and dense wines that reflect tension and poise with expressive sweet notes and complex flavours of nut paste, candied fruits, white chocolate and much more besides.
- 303 Louis Roederer Vintage Rosé, 2010** £97.50  
An expressive rosé that leads with aromas of wild berries, followed by gorgeously fragrant notes of flowers, zest and spice; this is rich and full-bodied, combining exotic touches with notes of dried fruit and cocoa and a remarkably bright, mineral turn from Chardonnay.
- 304 Cuvée Dom Perignon, Épernay, 2004/05** £192  
The 2004 is said to have left its mark on the history of DP. Dom Perignon is only made in exceptional vintages and if the harvest fails to make the exacting standards there will be no vintage produced that year. On the nose is a touch of almond and cocoa. The palate has a unique balance between density and weightlessness. It really is the perfect celebration fizz.
- 305 Bollinger Special Cuvée Brut NV** £72.50  
The Special Cuvée is the result of blending the grapes from the harvest and reserve wines including some which have been aged in Bolly's cellars for 15 years or more. The nose is complex; some ripe fruit and spice which is balanced with the sweetness of apples. The palate sees more of a structure; very soft bubbles with spice and pear.
- 306 Krug Brut, Grande Cuvée, Reims, NV** £197  
A blend of 120 different wines go into these bottles from an array of 10 or more more years. Wines are then stored for a further 6-10 years in cellars. Over 20 years of work go into each bottle of wine. Oak adds toast and weight and helps give the palate deep richness. Perfectly balanced with citrus and hazelnut. Krug really does deserve its luxury status. It is a non vintage like no other!

## WHITE WINES

### Light, fresh and restrained

- 13 Vidigal, Vinho Verde, Portugal 2015** £22.50  
Translated literally as young wine this has a lightly fruited aroma of tropical fruit and flowers. On the palate is a slight effervescence and sweetness that balances its green, herbaceous acidity.
- 14 Picpoul de Pinet, Domaine Des Lauriers, Coteaux du Languedoc 2015** £25  
Just to the South of Montpellier lies Picpoul. Picpoul de Pinet is one of the finest wines to drink when out in the sun and with fresh fish and seafood due to its rounded style balanced with lemony acidity.
- 15 Erdener Treppchen Riesling Kabinett, Meulenhof, Mosel 2013/14/15** £35  
One of the food pairings I have read for this wine is Ethiopian cuisine. I am not sure I entirely agree but what I would say is as it's only 8.5% you can enjoy it all afternoon with anything you like. It has zingy lemon with a hint of sweetness on the palate with a grassy, zesty nose.
- 16 Geyrhof Rosensteig, Gruner Veltliner, Kremstal, Austria 2015** £38.00  
An absolute classic Gruner Veltliner and a definite top choice to be drunk outside in the sun and a fantastic accompaniment to charcuterie or seafood platters. An organic wine with a lovely balance between its dry acidity and minerality, on the nose and palate are green apples that open up into some tropical and stone fruit characters and a long and slightly creamy finish.
- 17 Domaine Trotreau, Quincy, Loire, France 2014** £32  
Quincy is a small appellation Southwest of Sancerre in the Loire valley - one of the more beautiful places I have visited. The "terroir" as we call it is unique with sandy soil and pink limestone making the Sauvignon Blanc unlike any found around the world. 50 years ago Quincy was more recognised than neighbouring Pouilly-Fumé or Sancerre for its quality but is now struggling to keep up. So here we are fighting the corner for this excellent wine.
- 19 Churton Sauvignon Blanc, Marlborough, New Zealand 2015** £34  
Where would we be without without Marlborough? This is a certified organic wine produced by a Shropshire lad. All hand harvested, this wine produces an aroma of stone fruit with an intense and almost creamy palate. The finish is the classic crisp, fruity flavours with fantastic length
- 20 Andre Dezat et fils, Sancerre, Loire, France 2015** £36  
The Dezat brothers (5 in total) are behind this marvellous bottle. Aromas of lime and nettle are in abundance but its balance is impeccable putting this wine above others in the appellation.
- 21 Domaine Simone Tremblay, Chablis, France 2015** £38  
Jean Gouley and son, Philippe turned to organic methods in the '90's and have since gained a well respected place in Chablis AC due to its purity and minerality. The brand name Simone Tremblay' is used in memory of Philippe's mother. This wine is clean, full of vivacity and finishes with the sweetness of apples and almonds.



## Fuller-bodied, fruity and crisp

- 23 Don Cristóbal 1492 Torrontes, Mendoza, Argentina 2016** £25  
Don Cristóbal started its production of wine in 2001 and has since kept its winery up to date with the very latest state of the art equipment. However, the harvesting of grapes is still done by hand ensuring only the ripest and best grapes are picked for their bottles. Delicate aromas of honey and peach with a carefully balanced acidity with a juicy and lengthy finish
- 25 Cousino Macul Chardonnay, Velle del Maipo, Chile 2016** £24  
The Macul cellar, built in 1870 is considered to be one of the most efficient and grand cellars in the world. The wine is fairly rich and full of character. The ripe, unoaked Chardonnay shows off its butteriness and toffee which is balanced with an edge of lemon
- 26 Vignoble Clement Klur, Pinot Gris, Alsace 2010** £39.50  
The Klur family have been making wine in the Alsace since the 17th century and the traditions of wine making has passed through the generations. For over 10 years they have been following biodynamic, ecological and biological practices. The Klur family define this wine as "The great seducer of the range" with its straw yellow appearance and flowery, fruity nose. The palate starts fresh and develops a wonderful fruitiness. Very classy indeed!
- 27 Domaine Guerrin et Fils, Pouilly- Fuissé Vieilles Vignes, France 2013/14/15** £52.50  
All of the vines here are well established and are at least 40 years old - as old as Mr Guerrin himself. The wine is hand harvested, ensuring the best grapes are pressed. Oak barrels are used, of which 15% of them are new oak and is aged for about a year allowing for its flavour to develop. The nose has a sweet and floral element complimented by fruitiness. The palate is quite rich but is fully rounded with a buttery edge.
- 29 Vigne Alte, Zeni, Lugana DOC, Italy 2015** £29  
The location of the vines are situated on the Southern edge of the very picturesque Lake Garda. Three siblings of the Zeni family are at the helm of wine production. The Lugana demonstrates a rich and intense nose with peach and citrus. The palate is clean and fresh with a full-bodied but yet delicate side. This is a young, ready to drink wine, perfect with fish or simply as an aperitif
- 30 Lagar de Cevera, Albariño, Rías Baixas, Spain 2014** £42  
Lagar de Cevera enjoys a very particular and unique microclimate. The vineyard benefits from a lot of sun exposure and consequently the grapes ripen sooner. The hand harvested wine really does stand out for its aromatic intensity of apricots and pears with a background of pineapple. A very pleasant sensation of freshness greets the palate with a complex and well balanced finish.
- 31 The Spee'Wah, Semillon Sauvignon, Murray, Australia 2015** £30  
The Spee'Wah range is inspired by Crooked Mick- one of Australia's most popular mythical heroes. The Spee'Wah is a vast area of land in which Crooked Mick lived. Elizabeth Richardson is behind this wine and her one and only aim is to ensure you reach for another glass. Plenty of tropical fruit on the nose and some citrus on the palate make this light and very refreshing.
- 33 Chateau Doisy-Daene, Bordeaux Grand Vin Sec, Denis Dubourdieu 2009/12** £52.50  
Pronounced nectarine, citrus, pear, apple and quince aromas and flavours, supported by a little toasted spicy oak. Full of character, with great depth, excellent levels of acidity and superb length of flavour. Fabulous dry, crisp and mineral stuff.

## Rich and weighty

- 34 Three Graces Marsanne / Viognier / Roussanne, Château Tanunda, Barossa Valley, 2014** £31.50  
A beautiful wine achieved by a three-way blend where the Marsanne brings elegance and texture, the Viognier finesse and flavour and the Roussanne grace and structure. The wine is a classic Barossa: rich, ripe, concentrated and intense.
- 35 Catena Chardonnay, Mendoza, Argentina, 2014** £36  
This is worthy of comparison with expensive white burgundies – lovely buttery fruit but with exotic accents underneath.
- 36 Gewurtztraminer, Bruno Sorg, France, 2013/14** £42  
Lively, spicy Gewurtztraminer nose, then soft, full and well-balanced fruit on the palate with lychee and tropical fruit flavours. Full and rich from a grower who excels with both Gewurz and Pinot Gris.

## ROSÉ WINES

- 5 La Colombette, Vin de pays des Coteaux du Libron, France 2015** £21  
Made with organic Grenache. A very light rosé with a touch of fruit on the nose but well balanced with acidic qualities.
- 37 Chateau Tour de Mirambeau, Bordeaux 2015** £28.50  
A delicious strawberry-scented rose with hints of cassis. A good partner for many foods.

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## RED WINES

### Light to medium body, juicy, little oak

- 39 Los Coches Pinot Noir, Reserva Casablanca Valley, 2016** £29.50  
This is a classic New World Pinot Noir, it is packed full of fresh red fruits. It has a lots of character and a long finish and not too jammy.
- 40 Macon Rouge, les Bruyeres, Nadine Guerin 2015** £28.50  
The Maconnais is easily overlooked as a source of good Pinot. This is bursting with luscious burgundy fruit.
- 41 Esterhazy Pinot Noir, Austria, 2013/14** £38  
Bit of a revelation to those new to Austrian wine, this is a delicious, forward mouthful with all the fruit of pinot noir but none of the farmyard.
- 42 Fleurie, Andre Colonge 2015** £45.50  
Third-generation family producing very attractive, broad strawberry flavours with great consistency.
- 43 Givry 1er Cru, Clos Jus, Gerard Mouton, 2014** £58  
Very good value red burgundy with tons of ripe but delicate fruit.

### Medium weight, lightly spiced and oaked

- 44 Chateau La Baronne, Les Lanes, Corbieres, France 2012**  £34  
An Organic red wine from the exceptional Domaine Des Lanes, The Lignerès family take particular care to preserve the vineyard and it's soils. This wine is a blend of Grenache and Carignan, it is a fresh and attractive Corbieres, full of fruit and charm. Rich and mouthwatering this wine is a fantastic accompaniment to roast and grilled meats.
- 45 Ch.St. Eulalie, Minervois 2015** £24  
Super crunchy herb-scented fruit from sunny Languedoc.
- 46 Marques de Borba Tinto, Alentejo, Portugal 2015** £26  
Lots of good stuff coming out of Portugal these days, including this sweetly spiced, juicy-fruited bottle.
- 47 Alamos Bonarda, Catena, Argentina 2015** £27  
Terrific expression of this Malbec grape from Catena: loads of dark berry fruit, hints of violets and a little spice from oak.
- 48 Bird in Hand Two in the Bush Cab/Merlot, South Australia 2014** £36  
Typical dynamic Aussie blend giving bags of balanced fruit rounded out with a little American oak.
- 49 Sesti Grangiovese, Castello di Argiano 2014** £45.50  
A mini Brunello, heaving with cherries and cedarwood.
- 50 Bogle Vineyards Merlot, California, USA 2014** £46.50  
Optimal conditions allow this merlot grape to develop undisturbed, whilst gathering balance and complexity with hints of sweet basil and other summer herbs on the nose swiftly followed by black cherry & ripe plums.
- 51 St Aubin 1er Cru Les Perrières Domaine de Valliere, France 2014** £57.50  
Les Perrières is the vineyard name of where this wine comes from and it's in the village of St Aubin in Burgundy. It is made from 100% Pinot Noir. It has intense aromas of cassis and red berries with flavours of black cherry, vanilla and an earthy spice.

### Full-bodied, spicy, higher alcohol

- 52 Fina Nero d'Avola, Sicily 2015** £27  
Excellent rendering of this Sicilian grape – dark, brooding black cherry fruit softened by gentle tannins.
- 53 Dinastia Vivanco Crianza Rioja, 2013** £37  
A Tempranillo-based blend, this has a very spicy, peppery nose of vanilla, and soft red fruits. There is good fruit freshness, with lots of cherry and ripe berry flavours. The ripeness of the fruit and sweet oak add to a perfect balance.
- 54 Battle of Bosworth Puritan Shiraz, McLaren Vale, Australia 2016** £43  
Aromas and flavours of damson, blueberries and dark chocolate. It's a full-bodied red wine, with a smooth texture.
- 55 Les Clos Perdus – Cuvée 91 , Languedoc, 2011**  £34  
Fermented by wild yeasts in stainless steel vats. A lovely raspberry colour. A vibrant yet easy drinking wine with a touch of flair.
- 56 Catena Malbec, Mendoza, Argentina 2014** £47.50  
"Real Wine with great spread of flavour on the palate" (Jancis Robinson)  
That's a bit of an understatement: this offers an amazing depth of flavour as well.

### Full-bodied, spicy, higher alcohol Cont.

<b>57 Cote du Rhone Villages, Garances, Rhone Valley, France 2012</b>	£34.00
This is a fantastic blend of Carignan and Grenache, the perfect choice to pair with red meats and game it is a medium to full bodied wine with rich tannins and an abundance of dark fruits.	
<b>58 Chateauf-neuf-du-Pape, Telegramme, H Brunier et Fils 2012/13</b>	£72.50
Lovely soft fruit with spice, herbs and a touch of leather behind. Quite forward in the mouth with soft, ripe tannins, great length and a luscious finish. This is the second wine of Domaine du Vieux Telegraphe.	
<b>59 Jasci Donatello Montepulciano D'Abruzzo, Italy 2014</b>	£31.50
Red fruits, jams, and a touch of chocolate. A well balanced and harmonious wine that is rich with a lovely intense ruby red colour. Best with meat dishes or gnocchi.	
<b>60 Vina Salceda Reserva, Rioja 2010/11</b>	£39
An intense and complex wine full of ripe blackberry and blueberry fruit with hints of cassis, the initial fruit is followed by a subtle flavour of spices, cinnamon, vanilla and cloves. The finish is long and aromatic.	
<b>61 Les Piliers de Maison Blanche, Bordeaux 2009</b>	£39.50
A classic claret blend of Merlot and Cabernet Franc, only 9000 bottles of this wine are made each year. The nose is black fruit, and has a full and round flavour with elegant tannins that add rather than detract. Perfect with most roast meats, particularly if accompanied by a sauce.	
<b>62 Roc desANGES, Reliefs 2011</b>	£58
A supremely elegant wine from the Roussillon. Smooth and velvety in the mouth with a long and delicious finish. Excellent with chicken, lamb or a boeuf bourguignon.	
<b>163 Chateau Gravier Figeac 2010</b>	£55
Harvested by hand and aged for 6 months in old oak barrels. This fine red claret is rich and spicy to the nose, full bodied and chewy to the mouth an excellent choice to accompany beef game and any other red meats.

A wonderful and expressive dessert wine from the southern Rhone, this Muscat is typical of the sweet wines of the region. It is a light coppery orange in colour with endearing aromas of oranges, marmalade and quince, on the palate it is bursting with candied fruits and honey. Its freshness and long syrupy finish make it a truly irresistible Muscat indeed.		
<b>434 Clos Lapeyre - Moelleux 2012 (50cl bottle)</b>	£7.50	£30
A very distinctive sweet wine from Jurancon, this is an organic dessert wine that is light in colour with a wonderful expression of sweet citrus flavours on the palate and to the nose.		
<b>435 Margan Botrytis Semillon, Hunter Valley 2012 (37.5cl)</b>	£11.50	£33.50
This is a fantastic sweet wine from the renowned Hunter Valley in Australia. The Semillon grapes used for this wine are attacked by noble rot which dehydrates the grapes whilst concentrating the sugar. The palate is rich and luscious with clean, fresh citrus fruits giving the wine a beautiful balance of richness and acidity.		
<b>436 Principe de Viana, Vendimia Tardia Chardonnay, Navarra 2013 (50cl bottle)</b>	£10	£40
pale gold in colour with candied and waxy fruits on the palate, rich but still full of freshness, The finish is long and clean leaving you mouthwatering for more.		
<b>440 Cave de Maury, France 1995</b>	£13.00	£58
This exceptional wine is bottled for our specialist organic wine supplier, it is aged in single barrels untouched from 1995 until it needs bottling. This is a rich and complex wine with flavours of ripe cassis, mulberry and prunes, it is a perfect match for chocolate desserts and other rich sweet dishes.
